Greetings, DCC!

We've had a busy start to 2024! The Christmas decorations are stowed, and the winter sermon series, "Color Courageous Community: Following Woke Jesus," is underway. We hosted a concert that benefited Martha's Task, where we listened to great jazz, ate wonderful food, and had the chance to purchase items Martha's Task's clients created. In addition, the 2024 DCC Board had a short retreat and were treated to soup, salad, bread, and dessert prepared by some very generous folks.

At that retreat, we listened as DCC staff shared their goals for 2024. Look for those inside this newsletter. One of the goals I will be working toward this year, along with the Board, is developing a five-year+ plan, which we hope to present to the congregation this fall. At the retreat, we began that process by brainstorming what we think the world will be like in 30 years. Our answers were a mixed bag.

In 30 years:

- the population will be older
- cold fusion will be perfected
- the wealth disparity will be greater
- there will be less in-person gathering
- Artificial Intelligence (AI) will play a greater role
- the U.S. will have universal healthcare
- the U.S. will have had a female president
- climate change will be a greater threat


In 30 years, we hope:


- people will be able to retire comfortably

DCC was generously awarded the Geraldine Hicks grant in the amount of \$3,000 to support our youth programming. We also received a grant from OKEQ-Bartlesville in the amount of \$1,200 for both Connections AND Open Table! I'm so grateful to these wonderful community resources for their support.

Some goals I have for the Youth and Young Adults programs for 2024 are:

- grow Open Table into a ministry that really fits the needs of the Bartlesville community.
- widen the pool of Connections volunteers so that our current sponsors can have a break if they'd like one. Having safe adults in our students lives is very important.
- implement more intergenerational activities for Connections so it feels like they're
 more connected to the life of the church. Coming to a Sunday worship service isn't
 an option for some of the students, for various reasons, but I'd still like for them to
 feel as though they are a part of the DCC community as a whole. I think that the
 adults in the church would like to see and know the students, and get a good picture
 of the ministry at work.

Our year in music is underway, and I wanted you all to know what is happening! This year, we hope to build a few changes into our music ministry to make it more meaningful and accessible to our congregation. We will be planning our anthem schedule around our sermon series, so the music and the sermons will complement each other more intentionally. I also will be working on transcribing our DCC lyrics to our various congregational songs into one primary songbook to make sure we have print resources for musicians that line up with the core values of our church.

Disciples Christian Church Financial Summary December 31, 2023

DCC's financial position is adequate for 2023. A few key points regarding DCC's financial position as of 12/31/2023 is as follows:

- Total Giving consists of Estimated Giving from last year's Stewardship Campaign plus Other Income, which includes rent received from Paths to Independence for use of DCC facilities.
- DCC's year-to-date giving totaled \$221,489 just shy of budget by 1.1%, or \$2,341.
- In 2023, expenses totaled \$238,402, exceeding budget by 1.6%, or \$3,829.
- Commissions at year end:
 - Total Administration Under budget by \$3,186, or 1.8%.
 - Education Utilized \$114 of the \$300 budget.
 - o Family Ministry Under budget by \$484, or 23.1%.
 - Fellowship Under budget by \$65, or 0.8%.
 - o House & Grounds Over budget by \$1,883, or 6.8%.
 - Outreach Remained on budget through year end.
 - Worship Under budget by \$316, or 10.4%.
- As of December 31, 2023, DCC had a net deficit of \$15,230, more than the budgeted year-end deficit of \$10,743, above budget by \$4,488.
- Although currently in a deficit position, DCC still remains in an overall adequate financial position as we enter 2024.
- DCC maintained \$101,776 in cash or cash equivalents in our checking, savings, CD's, and DCC Perm Fund accounts, a decrease of \$14,140.
- In May 2023, DCC purchased the following Certificates of Deposit:
 - o 7 month CD earning 5.00% Annual Percentage Yield (APY) with a current balance \$15,332.
 - o 14 month CD earning 5.25% APY with a balance of \$33,742.
- DCC Perm Fund maintained a market value of \$12,402.52 as of 9/30/23.

Happy January DCC! Family Ministries has so many exciting things happening this month; we hope you will get all the fun events on your calendar and plan to attend!



In **Worship** we are implementing new ways for the kids to get involved. We always need a candleighter to bring in the light, and starting in February kids will bring in the communion elements at the beginning of worship. Alex Buckner, will continue to host an activity in the Prayground area for older kids during the sermon. My goal is that the kids start to continue to see worship as something they participate in and not just something they watch.
